Eve's Journey - Stepping on the Snake by North Carolina Fiber Artist Naida Koraly is a collection of 38 originally designed stitched fabric artworks which follow history chronologically through the eyes of women from different countries, cultures and religions.

Quilts By Kathleen Rountree

Antique tablecloths, napkins, handkerchiefs, and bed linens are the canvas on which Kathleen Rountree creates unique wall quilts. In the process, she becomes a partner with the original needle artist, who painstakingly embroidered loving designs on pieces meant for daily use. The outcome is an artistic re-birth for the linen, now enriched with creative quilting designs that complement the original detailed handwork. Many of her works are already more than



100 years old. Hopefully they now have another hundred years to be enjoyed and admired.

30 Years of Collaboration

Kaffe Fassett & Liza Prior Lucy

Kaffe Fassett is the undisputed genius of color. His acclaimed work as a textile artist took a remarkable turn in 1993 when he met Liza Prior Lucy who introduced him to the world of quilting. Together, Kaffe's innovative design prowess and Liza's exceptional quilting and teaching talents have sparked a vibrant wave of inspiration, leading to a treasure trove of acclaimed books and stunning quilt designs. To celebrate their 30-year partnership, Kaffe and Liza curated the most iconic and meaningful quilts reflective of their journey. This gathering of inspiration reminds us of their collective influence which has encouraged quilters worldwide to embrace the brilliance of glorious colors and the beauty of bold designs in their craft and in their everyday lives.

This collection of fifty art quilts by ten makers about five wars is a statement on the diversity of ways we each respond to the prompt of the name of a war. Beginning with WWI and continuing with WWII, The Korean War, The Vietnam War the series finishes with The War on Terror which was still active at the time the works were under construction.

MOD-POP!

Winchester Modern Quilters curated by Alicia Nord Stoltzfus

The challenge was to only use two colors to create a quilt. Ourbackground had to be grey or read as a solid grey. The second coloris the POP of color - but only one color! We could use any color in thatfamily from light to dark. To further push our creativity, the pop of color could only be used in the shape of a triangle - equilateral, isosceles, right, scalene, acute, or obtuse. We prevailed and provedthat we could follow rules and the challenge was declared a success!

On The Edge

Art Quilters on the Edge

Art Quilters on the Edge (AQE) bring their unique styles and techniques to quilts and fiber art. "On the Edge" reflects our response to living in today's interesting times. Non-traditional fabrics, embellishments, and techniques, including painted and dyed fabrics, tell each maker's unique story.

Re+

Textile Artists of Virginia (TAVA)

Two letters provide almost endless possibilities to build words ranging from "read" to "rehabilitation". The Textile Artists of Virginia are well known for their way with words, be they as short as the 3-letter word "red" or as long as 15 letters building "repetitiousness". TAVA members reflected, reacted, and responded to reach real results and realize this renewable, relaxing, realm of remarkable fiber art.



Red and Green Quilts: An American Classic

International Quilt Museum

In true American tradition, red and green appliqué drew its origins from cross-cultural influences. English appliqué, colorful Germanic folk art, and an abundance of affordable American cotton fabrics combined to create a unique and distinctive quilt making style that first appeared about 1840 in the mid-Atlantic states. These exquisite quilts continued to be made throughout the American Civil War.

Serendipity

Fabric Poets

Our many art challenges began as creations made with intention and planning. Picking a design, auditioning fabrics then painting, sewing and finally quilting. Yet somewhere in the process wondrous changes began to take shape. Our work takes a sudden and unexpected turn for the better. Colors shine, shapes enhance and our eyes see visions that were not there before. A stroke of luck or a happy accident. It simply is starting something good while creating something else—it's serendipity!

Webfabrics

This special collection celebrates two years of Webfabrics, showcasing 12" art quilts created by talented quilters, each inspired by a favorite song or album.

Each quilt is a unique expression of music brought to life through the art of quilting. From classic hits to modern anthems, these vibrant pieces reflect the power of music and the creativity of our quilting community.

Threads of Legacy - Honoring Stevii Graves

The Graves Family

Stevii Graves, a revered figure in the quilting community since 1975, celebrated as a quilter, educator, and judge. She served as the judging coordinator for Road to California from 2002 and led organizations like the California Heritage Quilt Project and Quilt San Diego/Visions. Her mentorship influenced Matt Reese, current owner of Road to California, shaping his leadership and vision. Her legacy lives on through the Stevii Graves Memorial Director's Choice Award at Road to California and inspires events like Road to Virginia and the new CrossROADS event. The "Threads of Legacy" exhibit at Road to Virginia celebrates her creative journey, featuring her quilts that reflect her dedication to the craft and her impact on fellow quilters.

The Cherrywood Challenge Poppy Collection

Cherrywood Fabrics

The Cherrywood Challenge: Poppy is a striking quilt exhibit celebrating the iconic poppy flower—an enduring symbol of remembrance, resilience, and beauty. Created using Cherrywood's signature hand-dyed red fabrics, each quilt offers a unique artistic interpretation, ranging from bold abstraction to delicate realism. The collection highlights the creativity and craftsmanship of fiber artists united by a shared theme and a rich, cohesive palette.

Threads of Nature

Doors, Windows, & Portals 20 Perspectives

Doors, portals, and windows are openings that enable something to flow through from one place to another. Windows in buildings can be highly ornate or functionally simple. They allow light, air, animals, and people to move through or see out. Our bodies' portals enable organs and blood vessels to connect. Computer networks rely on information portals and windows systems to run them. There are even spiritual and emotional portals which hide or provide solace and inspiration. Our members explored these many interpretations.

From Albums to Abstruct: The Evolution of Quilting Styles in the United States Curated by Virginia Quilt Musem

From the intricacies of broderie perse quilts in the last 18th and early 19th centuries to the postage stamp quilts popular in the early 20th century to the use of blank space in modern quilts, quilting has changed and evolved over the past 250 years in the United States. While quilting predates the founding of the United States by centuries, the evolution of quilting styles in the US is distinct and a beautiful story.
